COMMENT: Councilperson D'Loss explained that this is part of a larger 15-year MS4 project throughout the borough. ALCOSAN is funding 85% of the project with the borough responsible for the remaining 15%. The work will be centered around Seventh Avenue Park neighborhood and there will be minor traffic disruptions in that area.

- 5. Code Enforcement and Community Development (Councilperson DiPietro) DeBlaze restaurant is opening next week at 131 East Main. The Pittsburgh Pirates charity Fields For Kids is providing a matching grant to restore the batting cages at Chioda Field.
- 6. <u>Manager's Report –</u> The Business Privilege Tax invoices will be sent out to businesses in the next couple of weeks. Advertisements for the flashing beacon will go out in the coming weeks to get contractor bids.
- 7. <u>Mayor's Report In December 2022</u>, there were 8 criminal arrests and citations, 76 traffic stops (44 on Forsythe Road), 11 traffic tickets, 41 parking tickets, and 916 calls and self-initiated activity.

Carnegie Police was awarded a grant for \$178,786 from the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency for equipment and technology upgrades. The Parkway West Rotary Club in partnership with Representative Anita Kulik donated funds to cover the cost of an e-bike and helmets for officers on patrol.

Special thanks to all the volunteers who helped with the success of Carols and Lights in December. Finally, Carnegie was recently named a 2022 Monarch Champion through the National Wildlife Federation for the borough's completion of 24 action items as part of the Mayor's Monarch Butterfly Pledge. The borough is one of four municipalities to earn this designation.

On January 26th, Benny Benack is returning for a show at 7pm and on February 4th at 8pm, Dr. Zoot will be performing. The library will be hosting another interactive Earth Day Celebration.

<u>Joanne Letcher, Executive Director of CCDC –</u> The new DeBlaze restaurant will be opening on January 16th. A BBOC meeting will be held on January 19th at 9am at Higher Voices, with future meetings to be continually held on the third Thursday of the month. Love Bites Stoll is returning on February 10th from 6pm-9pm with local businesses participating on East Main Street.
