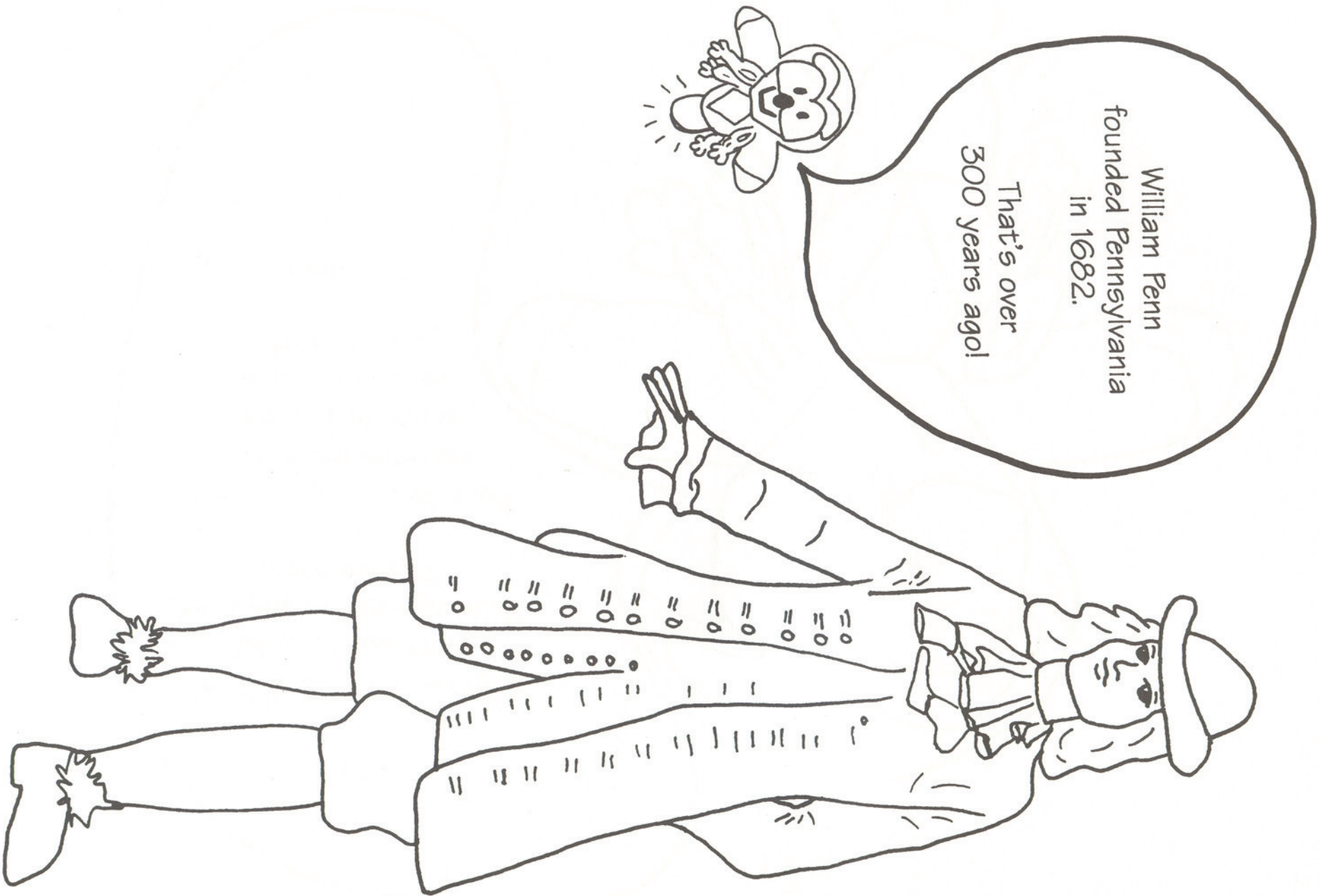

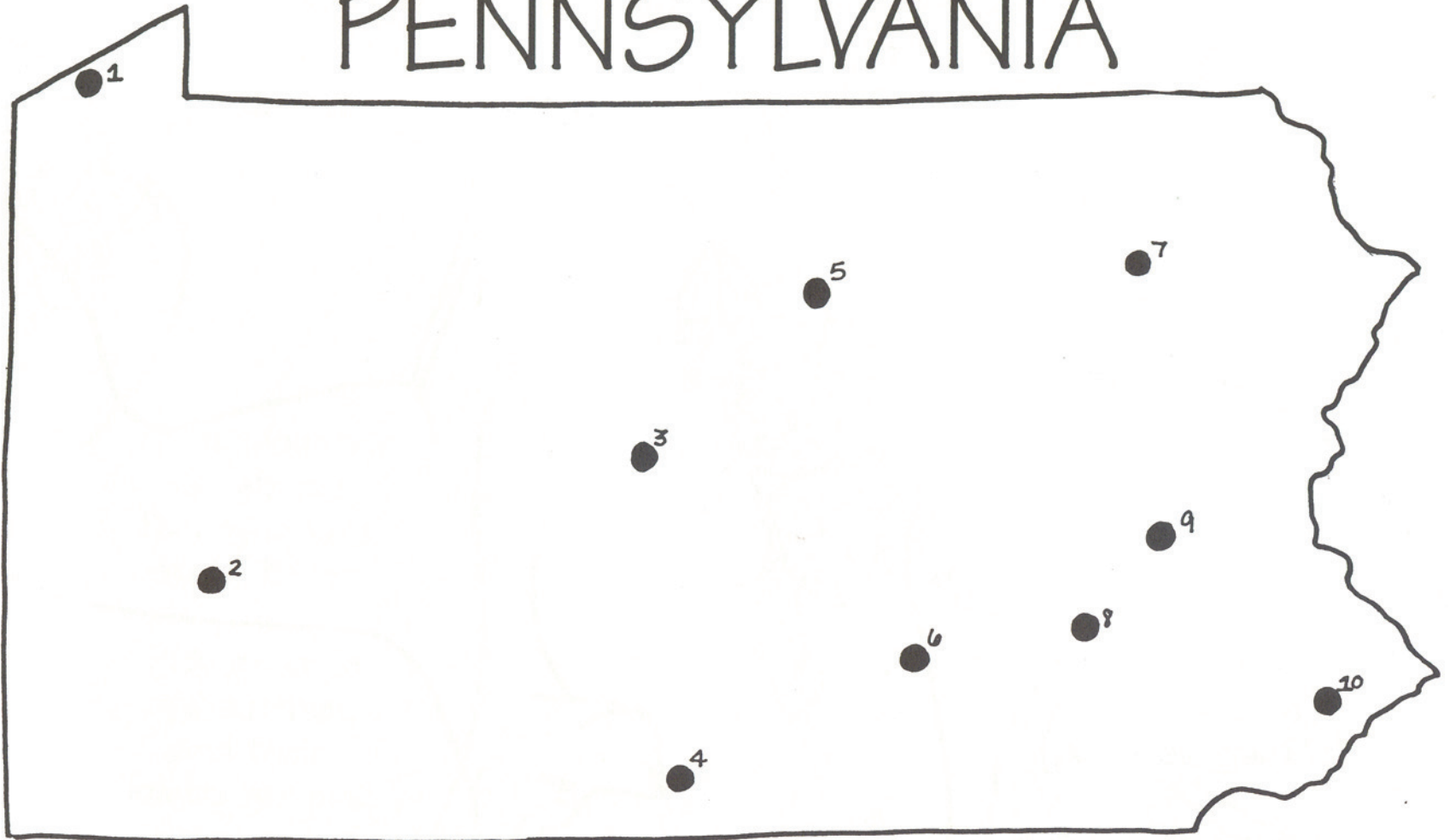




William Penn

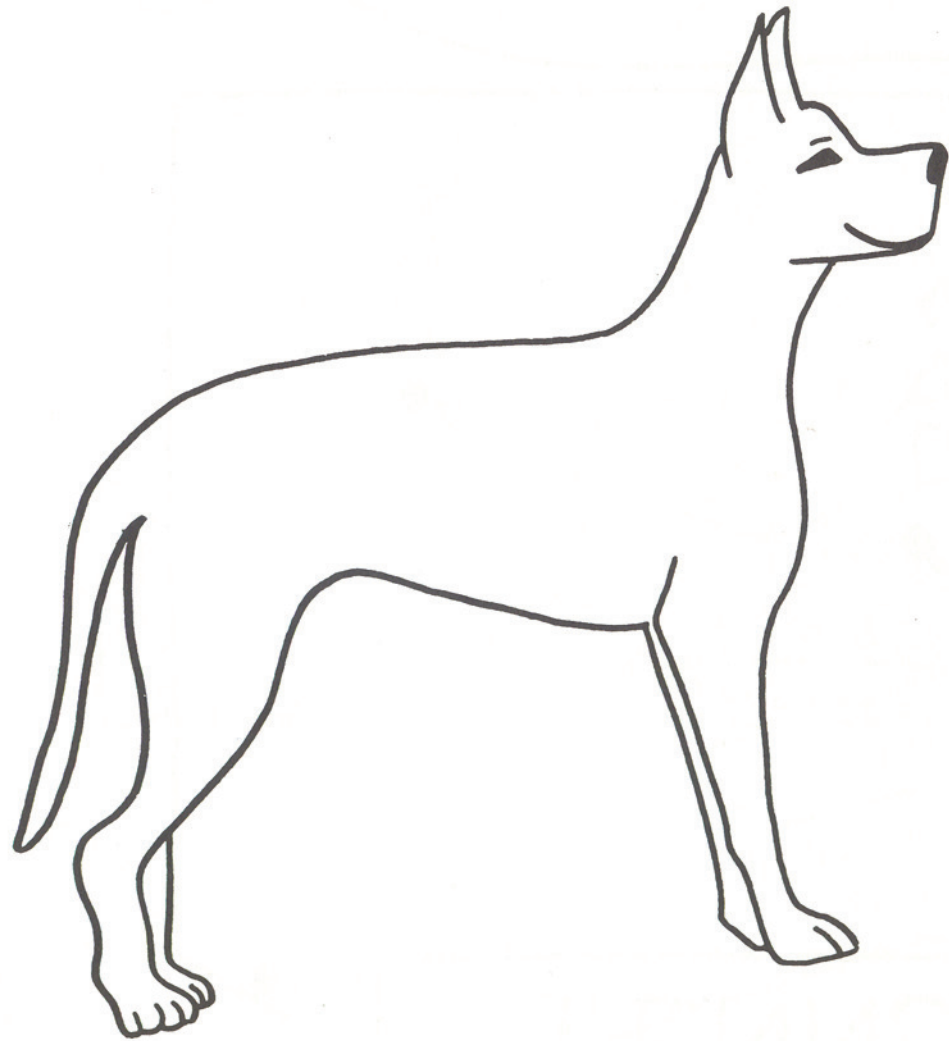

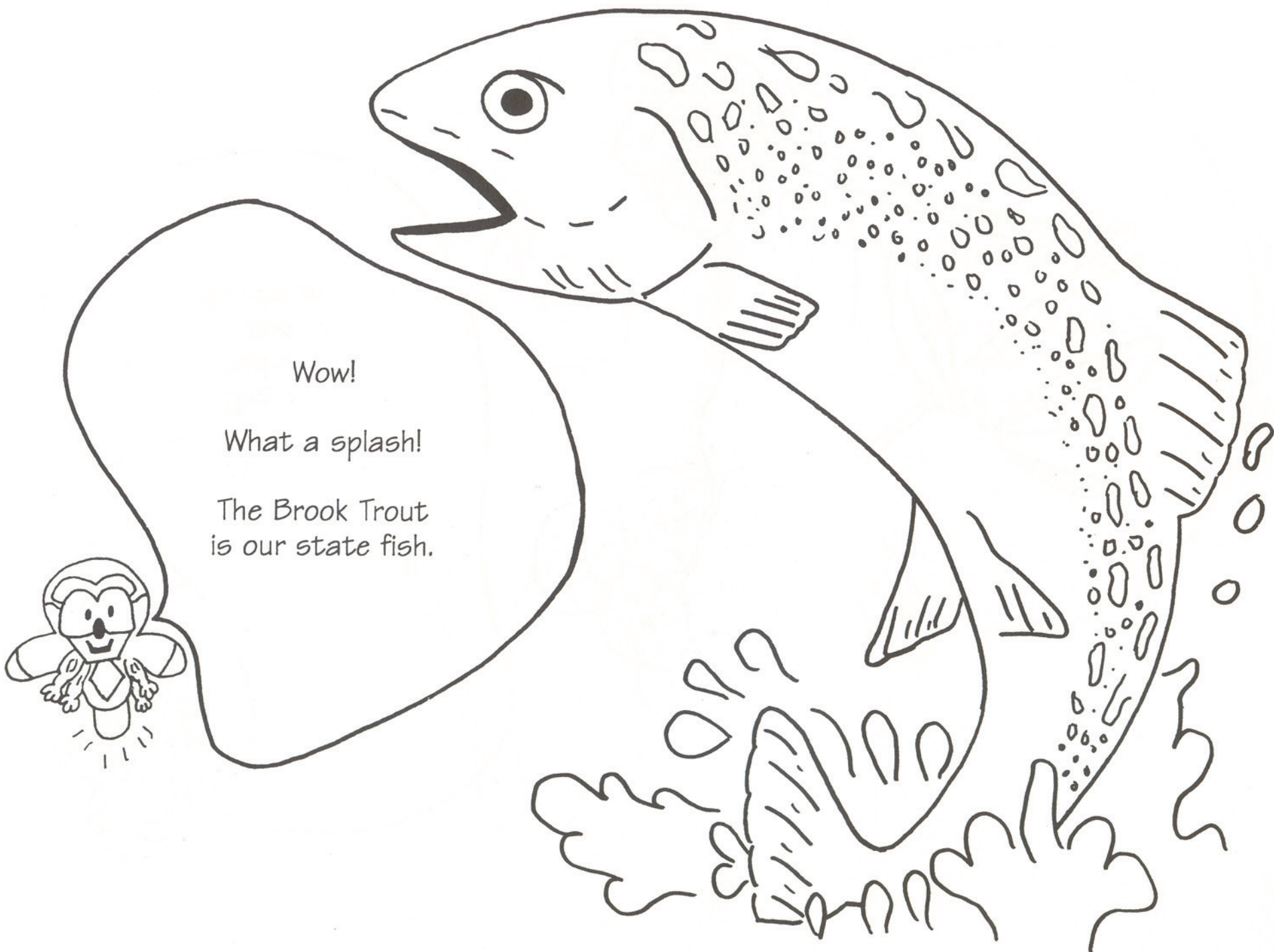
The Great Dane is

flowers are pink.

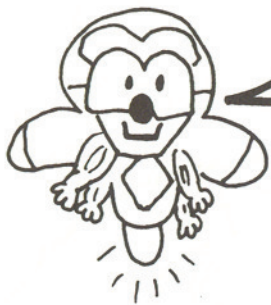

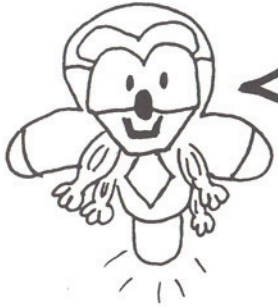
The Brook Trout
is our state fish.



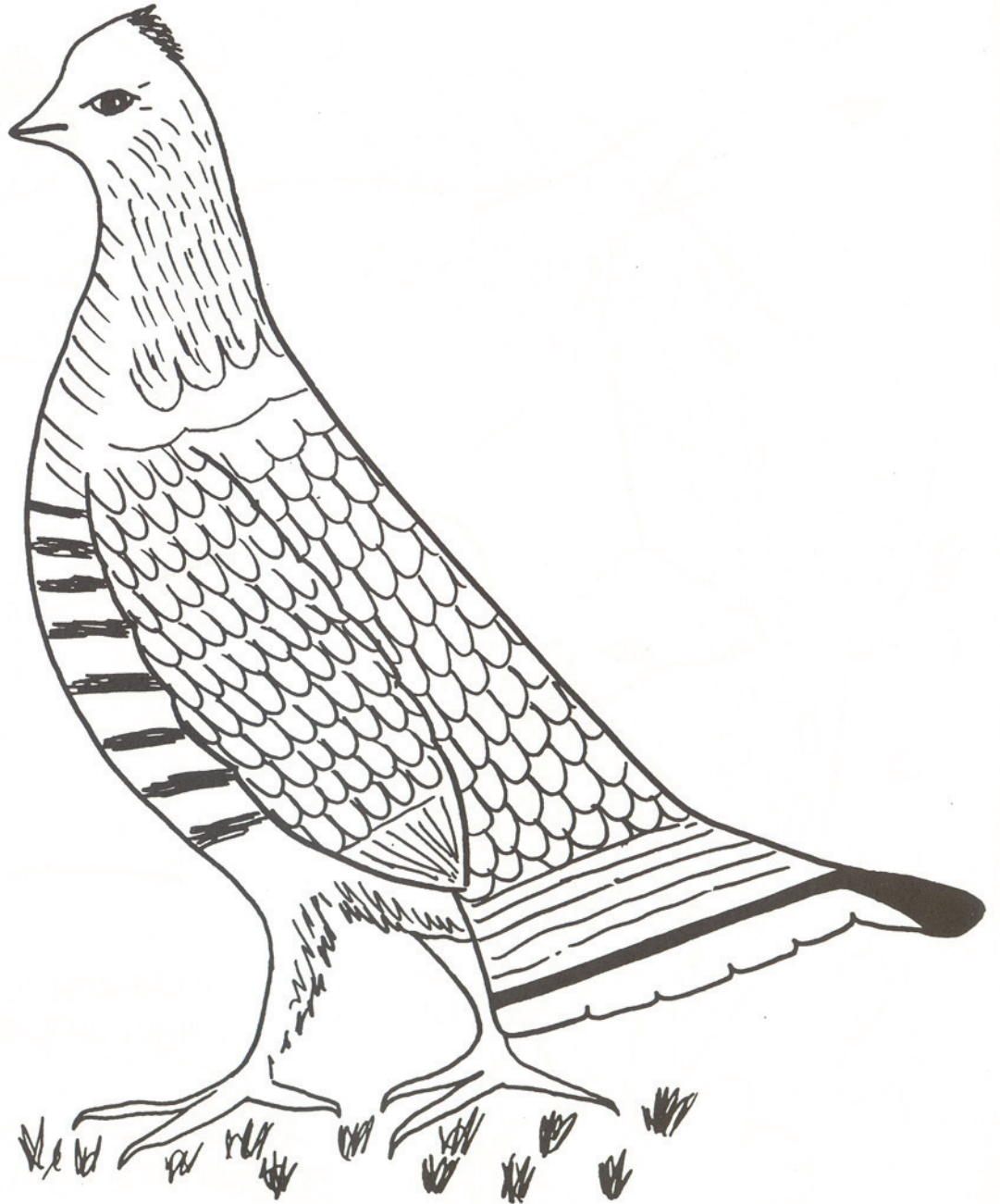
Watch out! There goes a Whitetail
Deer, our state animal.

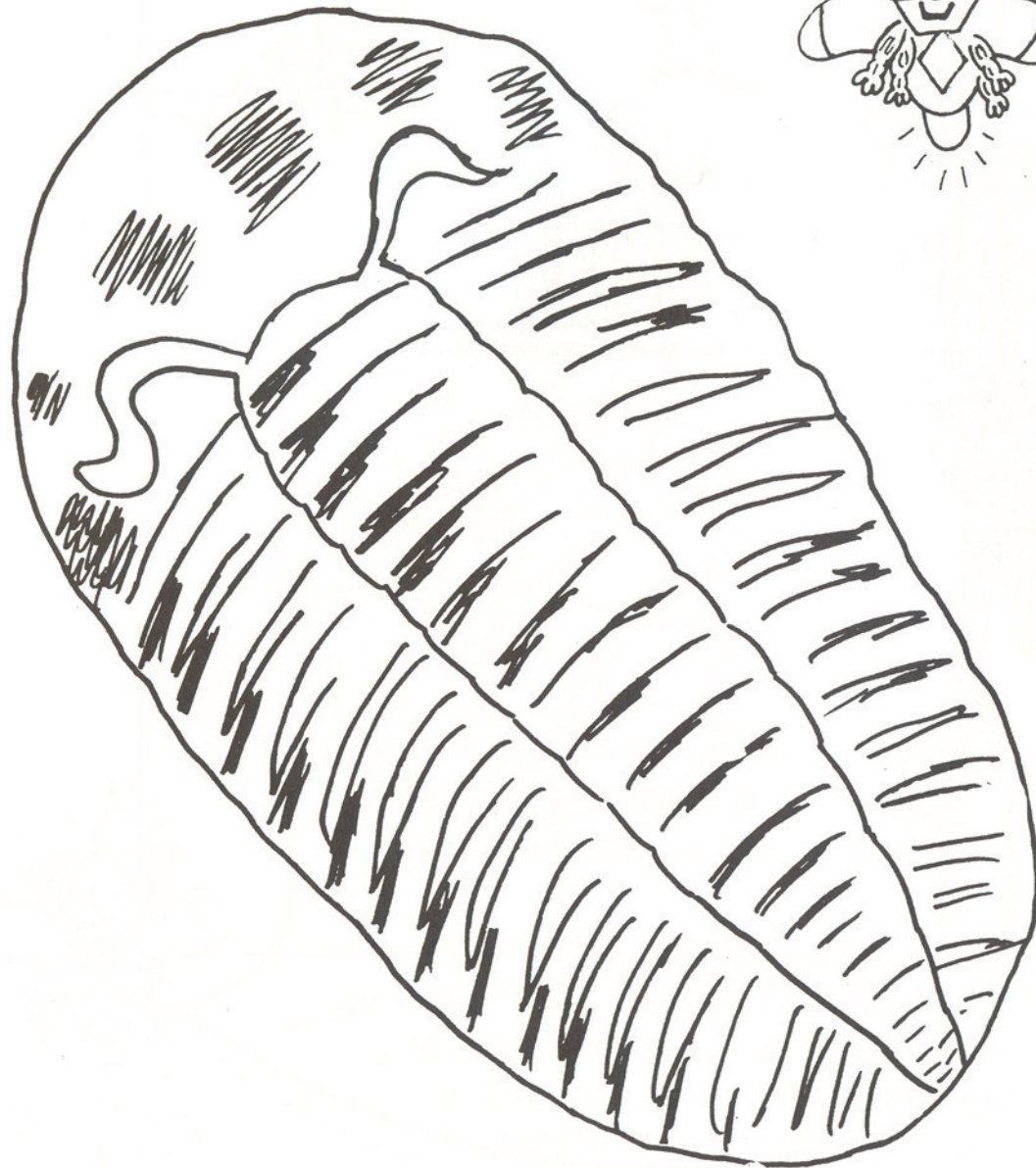
There are over one million Whitetail
Deer in Pennsylvania.





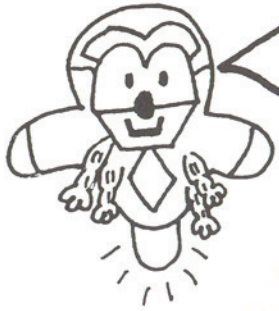
The

state bird.





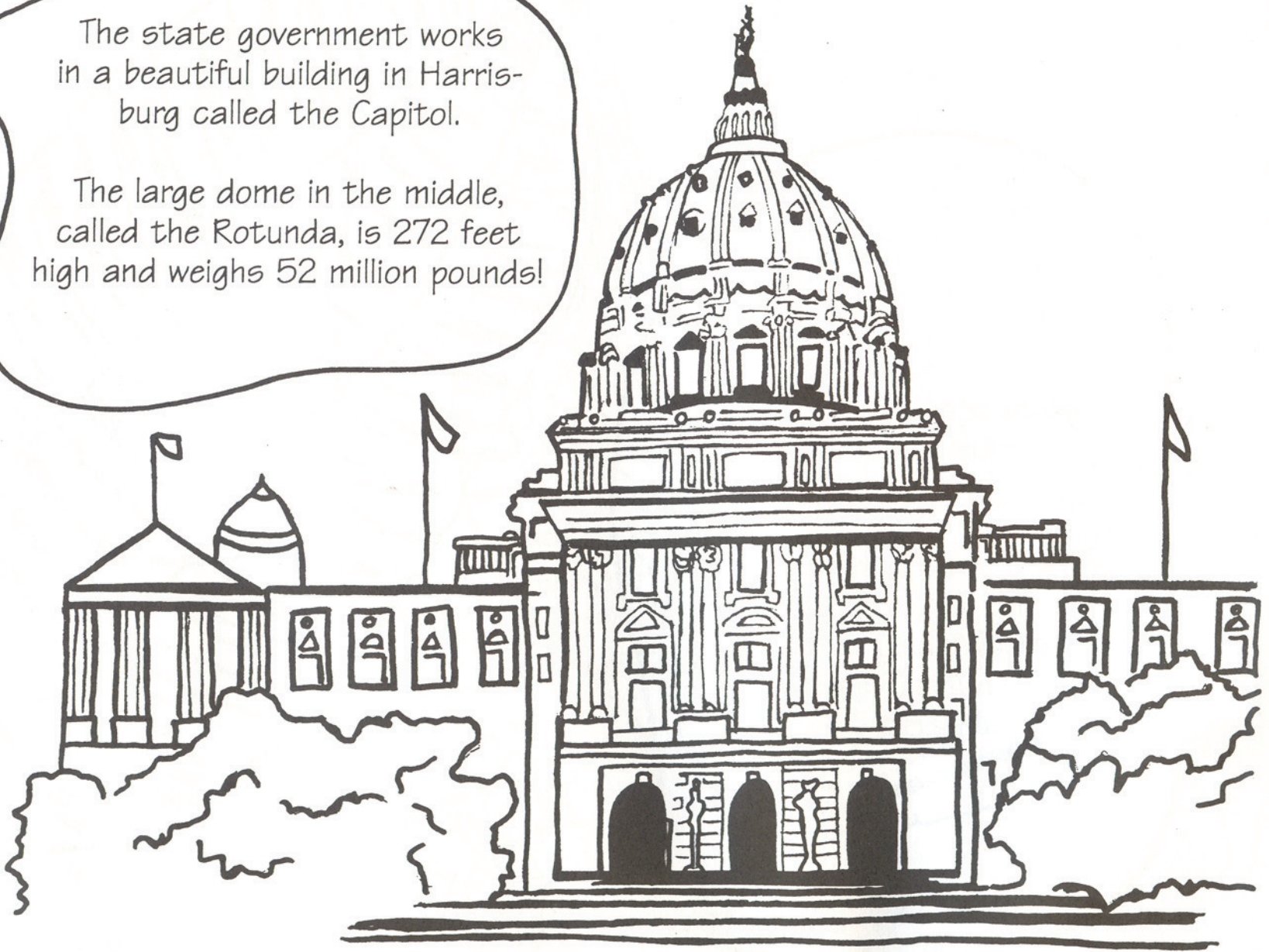
This strange

years ago.

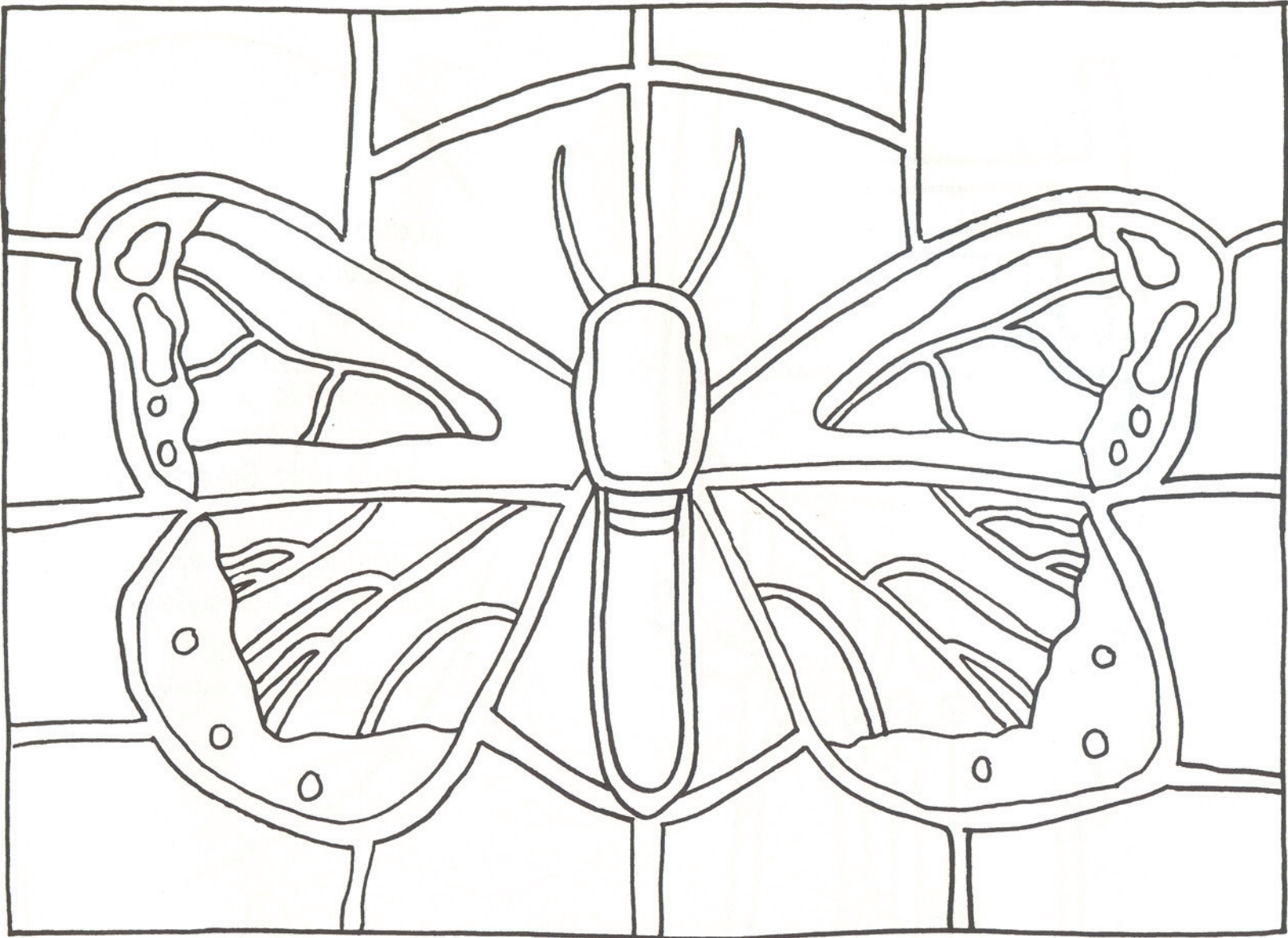
It's name is

The large dome in the middle, called the Rotunda, is 272 feet high and weighs 52 million pounds!





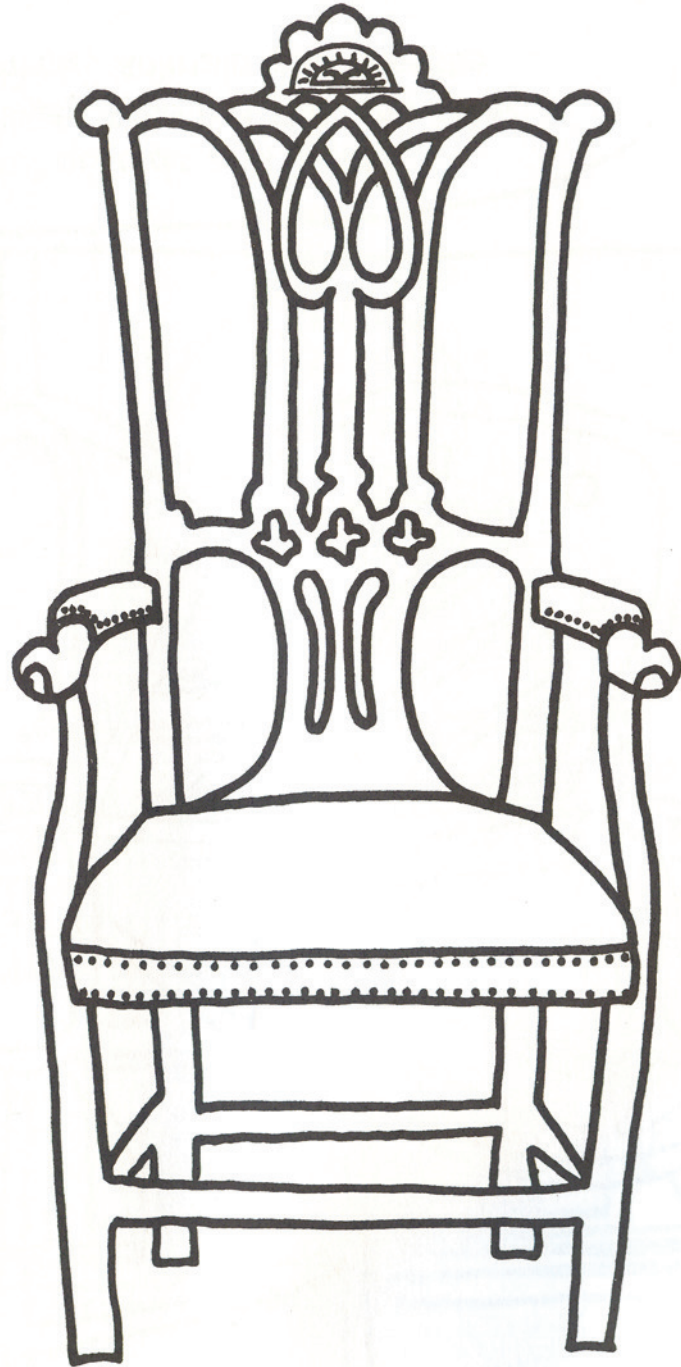
The Capitol is beautiful outside and inside.

once sat in that chair!



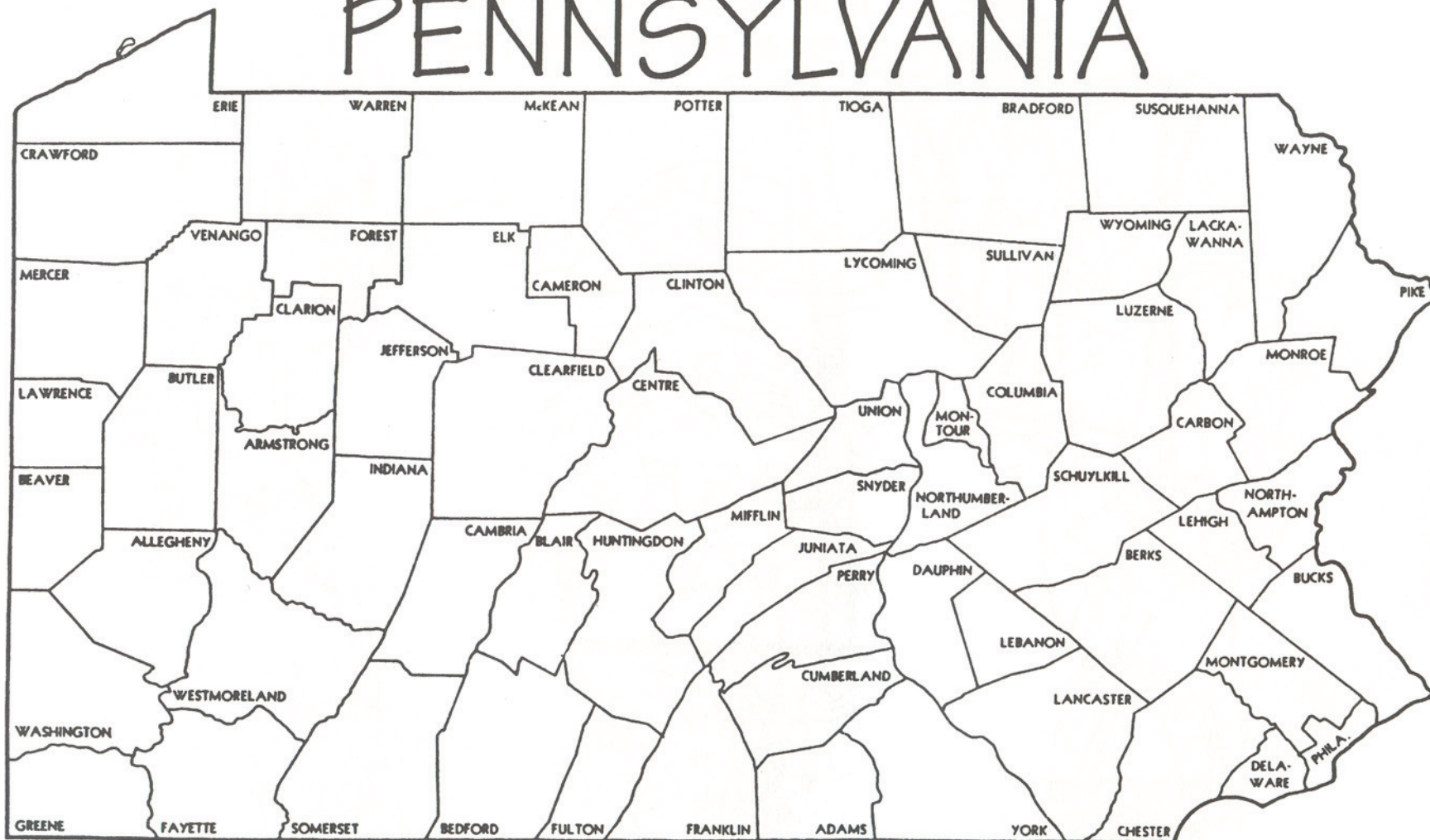

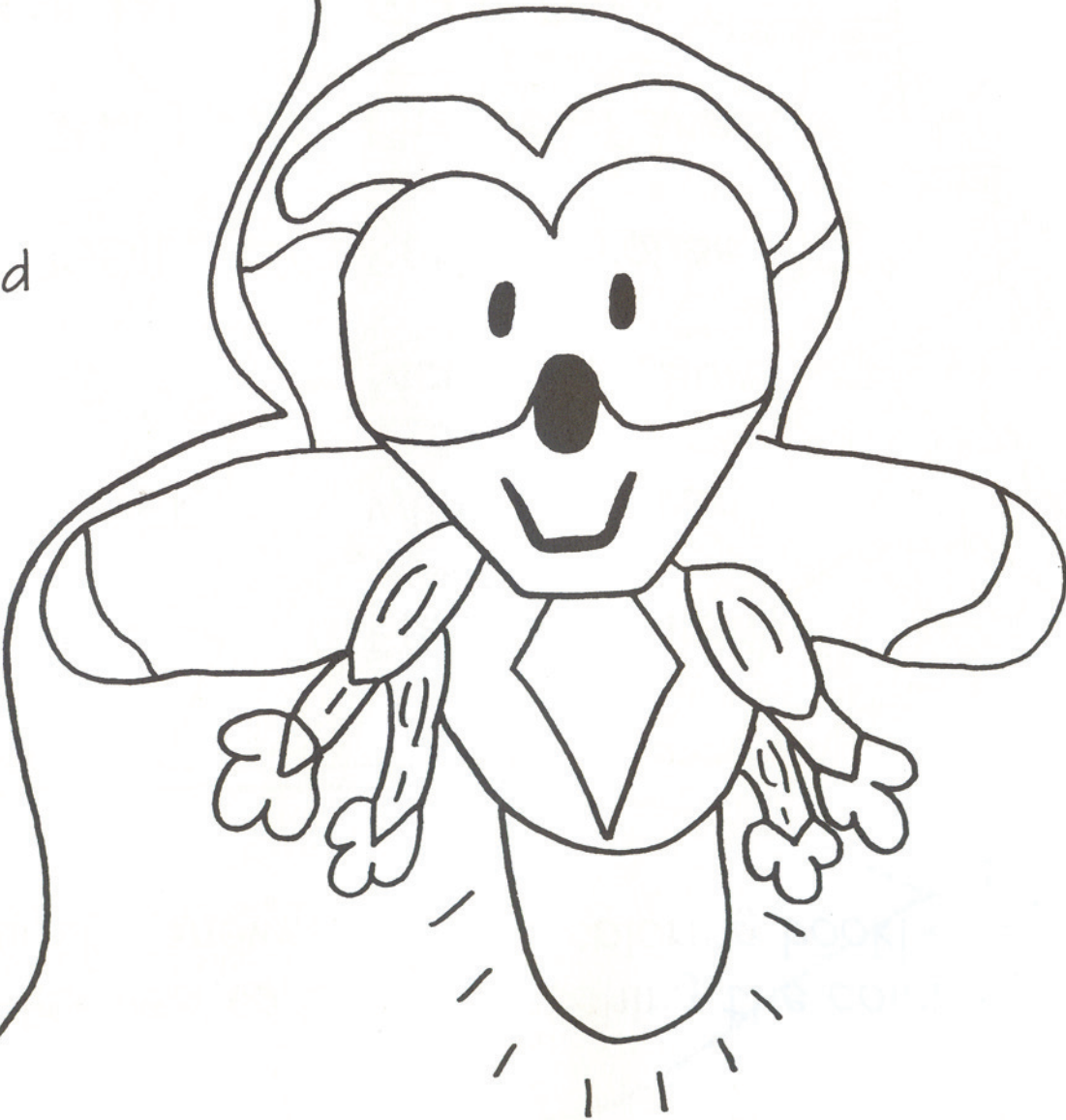
