Manager's Report. The Borough Manager reported to Council that a whiskey distillery has been approved by the Planning Commission for 230 East Main Street. They received a preliminary approval by the Planning Commission pending further details.

The Borough Manager also reported that the Borough will be sending out our 2017 Landlord Tenant Registration in the next couple of days and will be due on June 1, 2017.

<u>Carnegie Volunteer Fire Dept. & EMS Report.</u> For the month of February fire calls for 7, EMS calls were 83. He also reported that Scott Township continues to be our ambulance provider until the Borough makes a final decision on a provider.

Mayor's Report. For the month of February 2017 — Criminal Arrests and Citations: 11; Traffic Citations: 62; Parking Tickets: 191; Complaints and Self-Initiating Activities: 760.

The Mayor reported on several armed robberies in town. Also, a recent vehicular damage incident.

A new police pamphlet has been designed and will be released soon.

The Mayor addressed the issue of the use of radar. The State and especially the State Mayor's Association has been a big proponent of being able to use radar as a means of speed control. Vascar is currently used in Pennsylvania for speed control. A bills have been introduced in both the Senate and House of Representatives this year to allow Pennsylvania's municipalities the use of radar. Pennsylvania is the only state that does not use radar within its municipalities.

The Mayor reminded landlords to perform background checks and report to the Borough when you re-rent. It is a public safety and taxing issue. This also includes the EIT tax.

Carnegie Stage from Off the Wall Theater will present "Why We Can't Have Nice Things" on March 18, 2017.

Carlynton High School will present The Sound of Music at the end of the month.

The will have its Annual 5K Run/Walk on Saturday, April 29, 2017. This is the 10th Anniversary of this fundraiser.

Festival of Colors will be held on Sunday, April 23, 2017 from 12:00 to 4:00p.m. There will also be a band.
