MOTION to approve the minutes from the Council meeting on Monday, November 13, 2017. Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to advertise for the 2018 General Fund Budget, Sewer Fund Budget and Liquid Fuels Budget.

Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to advertise a special meeting to take place on December 28, 2017 at 5:00 PM to finalize the Carnegie Borough General Fund, Sewer Fund and Liquid Fuels Funds. Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to advertise the 2018 Borough Council, Planning Commission and Shade Tree Commission meeting schedules.

Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to advertise Borough Ordinance No. 2446, an Ordinance of the Borough of Carnegie continuing Ordinance 981 of 1982, as amended by Borough Ordinance 2344 providing for setting of Carnegie Borough's Business Privilege Tax for the year 2018. Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to advertise Borough Ordinance No. 2447, an Ordinance of the Borough of Carnegie continuing the Local Tax Enabling Ordinance No. 806 (Mechanical Device), No. 808 (Real Estate Transfer), 809 (Earned Income), No. 2279 (Local Services) as amended for the year 2018.

Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to advertise Borough Ordinance No. 2448, an Ordinance of the Borough of Carnegie continuing ordinance 2386 (Providing for Non-Owner Occupied Dwelling Registration) for 2018.

Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to advertise Borough Ordinance No. 2449, an Ordinance of the Borough of Carnegie levying and assessing Real Estate Taxes for General and Specific Purposes for the year 2018 (Millage – 6.75). Millage continues to be the same as 2017.

Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to advertise Borough Ordinance No. 2450, an Ordinance of the Borough of Carnegie amending Chapter 18, Part 6 of the Borough Code of Ordinances relating to sewers and sewage disposal.

Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to authorize the President of Council, Borough Manager and Borough Solicitor to prepare and execute the documents necessary to obtain the 2018 Tax Anticipation Loan from PNC Bank in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 at a rate not to exceed 2.046% with no origination fee (pending credit approval).

Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Roll Call Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to adopt Resolution No. 2017 – 15, a resolution of the Borough of Carnegie authorizing the issuance of a Tax and Revenue Anticipation Note, Series 2018. Councilperson Boyd – this TAN Loan funds borough operations until such time as taxes and other revenues come into the borough. This is borrowed at a very favorable rate. Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to adopt Resolution No. 2017-16, a resolution of the Borough of Carnegie, in opposition to House Bill 1620 "Wireless Infrastructure Deployment" (WED) bill. Basically this removes boroughs' and townships' authorization to limit where cell towers can be. Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

# Finance (Councilperson Popichak)

MOTION to approve the December 2017 Bill List and Bill List Addendum.

Seconded by Councilperson Riley. Roll Call Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

## Public Works (Councilperson D'Loss)

MOTION to approve Payment Application No. 1 to Insight Pipe Contracting, LLC. in the amount of \$113,815.23 for sewer work completed between October 1 and October 21, 2017 for the 2017 Sewer Facilities Improvement Project, Contract No. 2017-03B (Lining Contract).

Seconded by Councilperson Sarsfield. Roll Call Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

MOTION to approve Payment Application No. 2 to Insight Pipe Contracting, LLC. in the amount of \$5,852.47 for sewer work completed between November 1 and November 30, 2017 for the 2017 Sewer Facilities Improvement Project, Contract No. 2017-03B (Lining Contract).

Seconded by Councilperson Sarsfield. Roll Call Vote: UNANIMOUS. MOTION CARRIED

Public Safety (Councilperson Sarsfield) - nothing for this evening.

Code Enforcement and Community Development (Councilperson Riley)

MOTION to approve the application of Mr. Robert Buttermore for the lot consolidation plan of Lot and Blocks 103-G-258 and 103-G-262 as recommended by the Planning Commission on November 28, 2017. Councilperson Boyd – this is a perfect example of the County's side yard program falling into line with some work that the borough did removing a blighted home from the property. If not for the county's program allowing for the addition of this narrow piece of property allowing it to become part of the lot of one of the neighbor's, it would be an empty lot that the borough would be maintaining and would serve no useful purpose. In this case, the gentleman adopted the lot and went through all the proper channels and it's going to become part of his lot, add value to his property and get a small amount of tax revenue. Borough won't have to maintain the property. This is a perfect example of all things working together.

# **Committee Reports**

<u>Public Works</u> – Council met with KLH Engineers to discuss sewer and road projects for 2018. A list of streets was identified and we'll be putting together some specifications in the early months of winter. We can start putting out bids for road repairs for 2018 and preparing bids for summer.

<u>Public Safety</u> – In our budget this year we allotted money for new cameras for our police cruisers. These serve many purposes, including training. This is a great benefit to the police department and the community. It was very important that council approved to put this in the budget.

President's Report - we will be passing the 2018 budget on December 28th at 5:00 p.m.

Manager's Report – Thank you to Council and the Mayor for another great year! There will be some changes for 2018. I've been fortunate that everyone has been in place for a long time. I am looking forward to 2018!

<u>Carnegie Volunteer Fire Dept. & EMS Report</u> – this past month there have been 22 fire calls and 20 ambulance calls. A reminder that Breakfast with Santa is this Saturday from 10 a.m. until noon. Please bring the children and stop by. We're hoping for a good turnout. Christmas trees sales went really well. We sold out of trees!

Mayor's Report – Police Dept. activity for November 2017: Criminal Arrests and Citations – 13; Traffic Citations – 60; Parking Tickets – 370; Complaints and Self-Initiated Activity – 789.

SEAS Hope Alliance has been working to bring some training and information on the drug epidemic that is plaguing every community. We have coming soon (hopefully in January) a Narcan training program. I have worked with Mayor Riley to make sure that the information gets disseminated. Shortly after that a seminar by the DEA. The Narcan training program will be available to anybody who wants to take it.

I'd like to thank all those that helped with our holiday functions and events. The Library did a wonderful job and this has become an outstanding success! Three or four years ago we moved the event to the Library from the Borough Building. Would like to thank the Carol Covi Children's Event Committee, especially Cheryl and Jeff Stephan, for all of their hard work. Really nice light up night. What a crowd! Children were excited and it was an incredible night! First Christian Church always volunteers and serves hot chocolate, Thank you! Thanks to Meals on Wheels for donating cookies and to Higher Voice for performing. Special thanks to the DPW – for all of their hard work and the tree looks absolutely fabulous! I think Carol Covi would be very proud!

Plenty going on this holiday season, the Nutcracker will be at the Library this weekend; Ugly Holiday Sweater Weekend in downtown Carnegie. Breakfast with Santa at the CVFD on Saturday and a Christmas concert at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton on Sunday.
